

## Contest rules of "Sport for Peace in one image" challenge as of March 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021

The **Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA)**, in partnership with **Sport en Commun** (represented by Sport Impact a simplified joint-stock company having its registered office at Rue A x Rue 4 Immeuble les Arcanes, Point E - Dakar, Sénégal), hereinafter together referred to as the "Organiser", is organising a photography challenge on sport and development, without obligation to purchase.

The competition, hereinafter referred to as "Sport for Peace in one image" challenge, is organised from Wednesday March 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021 to Saturday March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021. Its objective is to raise awareness among structures by inviting them to reflect on the values of sport as fundamental principles of peaceful and inclusive societies (Sustainable Development Goals #16).

### **ARTICLE 1: Purpose of the competition**

This contest is intended for African non-profit organisations, the competition consists of producing a photography illustrating the following message: "Sport for Peace in one image".

The competition will be open on Wednesday March 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021 at 5 p.m (GMT).

The deadline for submitting photos is Saturday March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021 at 4 p.m (GMT).

3 photos will be selected by a jury composed of members of JICA, members of Sport en Commun and elite athletes including Isabelle Yacoubou, Diana Gandega, both Champions for Peace (Peace & Sport) and Louis Saha, former Premier League footballer and Football for Peace board member.

The 3 winners will each win a pack of 30 JICA x Sport en Commun equipment kits containing shirts, bags, caps, pants, towels, drinking bottles, training bibs, bracelets, a timer and a whistle.

The 3 photos selected will be published on the Organiser's websites and Instagram, Twitter, Facebook and LinkedIn accounts on April 6<sup>th</sup> on the sidelines of the International Day of Sport for Development and Peace.

### **Article 2: Conditions of participation**

Participation in the contest is completely free of charge and implies that the authors certify that they themselves took the (no edit) photo without the assistance of a third party not mentioned.

Only non-profit organisations with a legal registration in an African country can participate to this challenge.

The participating structures must first be registered on the Sport en Commun platform ([www.sportencommun.org](http://www.sportencommun.org)).

Failure to comply with the rules by a structure will result in its disqualification.

### **Article 3 - Submission of applications**

The structures must complete the dedicated form on the Sport en Commun platform and submit their photo in .JPEG or .PNG format before Saturday March 20th, 2021 at 4 p.m. (GMT). The authorizations of rights to the image of the persons appearing in the photo will have to be submitted to the Organiser in the event of a request, within 8 days.

### **Article 4 - Copyright**

The applicant structures guarantee that their photo is original and unpublished. They guarantee the Organiser against any recourse by third parties having its object or its cause, main or secondary, in the content of its application form, in the authenticity and / or originality of the photography they selected for the contest.

The participating structures transfer on a non-exclusive basis, in Japan, Senegal and abroad, to the Organiser, in their entirety and without any reservation, all the economic rights as defined below that they hold over their work.

Thus, for the entire legal duration of the protection granted to authors and their successors in title. The transferred rights include:

- the right to reproduce and / or have reproduced, in an unlimited number, all or part of the work by any means known or unknown to date, digital, sound, audio-visual or multimedia, and in all formats;
- the right to represent all or part of the work, anywhere, by any process known or unknown to date.

This transfer is granted and maintained even in the event of an evolution in the personal and/or professional situation of the winners.

### **Article 5 - Image right**

The participating structures undertake to respect the image rights of the persons photographed and to have them sign a form for the free transfer of rights of their image. Likewise, if a minor is photographed, it is necessary to ensure the written consent of the holders of parental authority.

Finally, the participating structures must ensure the written consent of the owners when the properties of private or public persons are filmed.

The participating structures guarantee that they are in possession of all the authorizations of rights to the image of the people appearing in the photo (signed by the holders of

parental authority for minors). They guarantee the Organiser against any recourse by third parties having its object or cause, main or secondary, in the content of its application.

The participating structures undertake to provide these forms for the free transfer of rights to their image within 8 days in the event of a request from the Organiser.

The participating structures undertake to authorise the Organiser free of charge to reproduce and broadcast their images collectively or individually, or the images representing them, collectively or individually, directly or indirectly, for publications and public communication (by any means) and on any support to promote the competition. Any participating structure authorises, in advance, the Organiser to the quote or illustrate with their photography for contest communication purposes.

## **Article 6 - Jury and selection of winners**

Selection committees made up of members of JICA, members of Sport en Commun and elite athletes including Isabelle Yacoubou, Diana Gandega and Louis Saha. This committee will make a selection of 3 photos, taking into account the originality of the photos on the theme of the competition. The Organiser reserves the right to refuse a photo, for any production which would be considered:

- offensive to respect for the dignity of people (discriminatory, abusive language, pornographic content, etc.);
- in contradiction with the applicable laws;
- contrary to good morals and / or public order.

The final list of jury members will be drawn up before the deadline for submitting works and made public on the websites and social networks of the Organiser. The winners will be selected on the following criteria:

- adequacy with the theme of the competition;
- the originality and creativity of the photo.

The winners will be notified by email of the selection of their photo. Participating structures not selected will not be notified and no justification will be provided by the jury. The decisions of the jury will be sovereign, they do not give rise to any justification and are final.

## **Article 7 - Prize**

The 3 winners of the “Sport in the service of Peace in one image” competition will win a pack of 30 JICA x Sport en Commun equipment kits containing shirts, bags, caps, pants, training bibs, towels, drinking bottles, bracelets, a timer and a whistle. The kits will be sent to them by the Organiser and cannot be exchanged, nor against other prizes, nor against their price or value.

### **Article 8 - Acceptance of the rules**

Participation in this contest implies the unreserved acceptance of the candidates to these rules and to the principles of the competition. The regulations in their entirety are sent free of charge to any person who requests them, during the competition, on request to the Organiser.

### **Article 9 - Other conditions**

The Organiser of the competition, reserves the right to cease, interrupt or extend, shorten or modify the competition and its consequences at any time if the circumstances require and without any compensation. In all cases, it reserves the right to extend the period of participation. The Organiser cannot be held responsible for delays or losses of shipments, due to the postal services, or their destruction or loss by any other fortuitous event.

The simple fact of participating in this competition implies knowledge of these rules and their acceptance. Any fraud or attempted fraud in this contest by a participant will result in the disqualification of the team to which he belongs.

The Organiser reserves the right to modify these regulations if necessary, to make any decision that it may deem useful for the application and interpretation of the regulations, subject to informing the participating structures in advance.

### **Article 10 - Confidentiality and use of personal data**

Any participating structure can obtain communication and, if necessary, rectification or deletion of information concerning him / her, by contacting: SPORT IMPACT, Rue A x Rue 4, Immeuble les Arcanes, Point E - Dakar, Senegal.

### **Article 11 - Applicable law and disputes settlement**

The competition and the interpretation of these rules are subject to Senegalese law. In the event of a persistent disagreement on the application or interpretation of these regulations, and in the absence of an amicable agreement, any dispute will be submitted to the competent court of Dakar to which exclusive jurisdiction is assigned.
